Statement on how the building product is expected to contribute to compliance:

The objective of this Standard is to specify product performance requirements and test methods for bar chairs and spacers in reinforced concrete. Consideration was given to inclusion of durability requirements. However, the committee resolved that specification of durability reside with the design standards (such as AS3600 concrete structure, and NZS 3101 series, concrete structure standard), except for concrete bar chairs where impermeability is intrinsic to their performance and is not covered in the design standards.
